EVENT BIOSECURITY PLAN

A.Risk detection – critical points

- 1. Horses entrance into the area
- 2, Horses stabling
- 3, Parallel running of CEN-CEI competitions
- 4, Horses exiting the area

B.Risk prevention and minimalization

1, Area entrance – horses identification and health examination

- Horses Identification and health examination, during an arrival at the event, is going to take place in the exterior, outside of the area
- this space is located in front of the area at the gate num. 8 (check the map), the security will be present there as well
- Horse identification includes taking the number of the microchip, passport control, validation of the vaxination against flu and other infectious diseases, based on relevant FEI rules, and negative result of infectious horse anemia, not older than 6 months
- mandatory negative PCR test on EHV-1,4 and Equine Influenza for all the horses transported by an airplane with a date of sample collection no longer than 96 hours before arrival
- **horses health examination** includes temperature check (recorded in FEI Horse App) and basic clinical examination
- based on the level of body temperature and presence of clinical symptoms the horses will be divided into:

- ❖ healthy (body temperature 36,5 38,5, without any clinical symptoms of the disease) with granted entrance into the area
- ❖ Suspisous of the disease (body temperature 38,5 39,0 and/or clinical symptoms present) are going to be stabled in quarantied stables and monitor based on the specific protocol in accordance to FEI VRs
 - quarantine stables are located in the exterior, outside of the area, around 2km away from the entrance gate num. 8
- Sick (body temperature above 39,0 and/or clinical symptoms present) are going to be baned from the area
 - Owner/person in charge will be asked to show FEI self-certification, based on relevant FEI rules before entering the area
 - parking spots are going to be reserved between objects gate 8 and gate 9 (check the map)

2, Horses stabling

boxes preparation before the arrival of the horses :

- horses are going to be placed in the summer stables (check the map)
- ❖ all boxes will be cleaned up, disinfected and sealed
- map with the stabled horses will be available before the horses arrival

• horses stabling:

- ❖ all horses will be stabled using one-way system
- horses from the same transport will be stabled together
- horses vacinated against EHV will be stabled in the separate stable (if they were not from the same transport as nonvaxinated horses), check the map
- In order to avoid nose-to-nose contact we advice the PR to hang the sails

horse control in the stables

It is required to check the body temperature of the horse twice a day and recording of the results in the FEI Horse App (controls and sanctions in accordance with applicable FEI rules)

3, Parallel running of CEN-CEI competitions

(applied in case of organizing several events)

Horses taking part in CEN races are subject to the same rules as the FEI requires when organizing CEI races.

Horse examination on arrival :

This examination includes horse identification, control of the horse passport, vaccinations, test for Infectious Anemia, clinical examination and rectal temperature examination. Participants will also be required to manually record the horse's temperature for the last 3 days prior to arrival at the event.

Measurement of the horse's body temperature :

CEN participants must measure and record the horse's body temperature twice a day in a table placed on the horse's box

• Stabling:

Horses competing in CEN competitions will be stabled separately from horses competing in CEI competitions

Measures:

- disinfectants will be available at all important entrances (check the map)
- Only necessary number of people will be allowed in the stable
- ❖ no general public allowed at the event
- current rules of dog control (FEI General Regulations, Article 109.13) are going to be under stricter control

increased spacing at all important places, like horses cooling, veterinary examination, and relax space for horses will be secured during the competition

4, Horses exiting the area

Microchip or passport must be scanned before every exit of the horse from the area of competition, using FEI Horse App, to ensure traceability in the event of the outbreak

C.Elimination

Measures in the event of the outbreak of the disease in the area of competition, will be handled accordingly to the emergency plan.

SAFETY MEASURES APPLIED IN REGARD TO COVID-19 DURING ENDURANCE COMPETITION ON JUNE 9-11, 2023

Part I. ENTRANCE INTO X-BIONIC EQUESTOR SPHERE

- Entrance into X-bionic equestor sphere will take place through the gate num. 8. Entranced will be controlled by the security
- Security personnel in cooperation with stable manager will coordinate entrance of trucks with horses into the area and their guidance to the reserved parking lot
- Based on currently valid restriction in Slovakia it is not necessary to present any document (certificate) declaring a negative result of RT-PCR test or antigen test or recovery from COVID-19
- If person shows any symptoms of respiratory disease, it is necessary to contact own doctor and leave the area of a mass event

Part II. – RULES APPLIED IN THE AREA:

Movement of the visitors is free. Wearing the face masks or respirators FFP2 is not mandatory.

Every official will be given a disinfectant in plastic bottle (0,3 litre) as well as 20 pairs of rubber gloves at the entrance. In the event, that official runs out of disinfectant or gloves, they can refuel in the Event office.

Trash containers for disposable waste – biological waste are placed on visible sites and are marked.

The veterinary – HORSE SHOE ARENA – every entrance has enough disinfectant and disposable rubber golves.

Toilets and bathrooms are disinfected on 3 hours intervals.

Officials and participants meetings will always take place in the exterior.

Part III. GUIDELINES - HORSES

We ask participants to be responsible and to eliminate possible nose-to-nose contact between horses as much as possible. In the event of non-standard behavior of the horse (higher body temperature, no taste, etc.), please contact veterinary delegate or one of the members of veterinary commission immediately.

IV. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

2. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

ENTRY OF HORSES

Required health tests and vaccinations: Quarantine period: Specimen Import Licence applied:

All competing horses must be serologically tested (Coggins test) for Equine infectious anaemia (EIA). This test must have been carried out **within the last 12 months**. The certificate showing a negative test must be presented to the veterinarian examining the horse on arrival. Horse that have no such certificate or have a positive test will not be allowed to enter the showground and will not be allowed to compete in the event.

3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

4. PONIES

Ponies must be in compliance with the Veterinary Regulations Chapter IX to be eligible to compete in pony events.

5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post-mortem examination.

6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event.



Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1 PASSPORTS. FEI General Regulations, Art. 137

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses entered in CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (FEI General Regulations, Art. 137.2).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1003

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations. All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1029

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue. PRs must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp in advance of the event which will be checked at the Examination on Arrival.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1032-1040

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not



be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1046-1051and Annex VIII

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, preride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP). FEI Regulations, Chapter VII

8.1 SAMPLING. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1058

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses for information and details.

XIV. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. Insurances And National Requirements

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate.

1.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

1.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

1.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

2.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

1.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

2.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

2.2.2 Additional Liability Information



2.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

<u>FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarians (PTVs) (Art 1005) are to have adequate professional indemnity insurance.</u>

To be valid, all Prostests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompagnied by a deposit of CHF150. – or equivalent.

4. Modifications Of Schedule

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.

Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a results of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

FEI Endurance Organisers' Protocol

With an aim to further ensure the welfare of equine and human athletes at International Endurance Events, the safety of all participants and the implementation and respect of common principles of behaviour, fairness, and sportsmanship, the FEI has created this FEI Endurance Organiser's Protocol (hereinafter the "Endurance Protocol") to guarantee the correct and full application of the applicable FEI Rules and Regulations in your Events, in particular but not limited to, the FEI General Regulations, the FEI Endurance Rules, the FEI Veterinary Regulations, the FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes and the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.

In order for the FEI to approve the competition schedules the Endurance Protocol **must** be signed by the Organiser and the National Federation, listing the Event(s). By signing the Endurance Protocol both aforementioned parties agree to comply with all applicable FEI Rules and Regulations, and in particular (but not limited to), with the following requirements:

- 1. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Officials to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules, in particular:
 - Ground Jury Art. 853
 - Technical Delegate Art. 852
 - Veterinary Commission Art. 854
 - Chief Steward Art. 855
- 2. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Independent Governance Advisors (IGAs) to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules Art. 856
- 3. The welfare of the horse must be a first priority and you must allow the FEI Officials to take all necessary measures to safeguard it, as per the FEI Endurance Rules, including but not limited to:
 - Loops of the course must not be specially designed and/or constructed to encourage high speeds Art. 818
 - Allowing for the reduction of the pulse criteria Art. 816.9.2. The pulse criteria may be reduced during the ride if, in the opinion of the President of the Veterinary Commission in consultation with the Foreign Veterinary Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury and the Technical Delegate they believe there is a danger to the safety of the Horses.
 - The Veterinary Commission has absolute control on all matters concerning horse welfare Annex 5, Art.1.
 - The Technical Delegate or the Ground Jury together with the Veterinary Commission can decide to modify the length of timed holds according to extreme weather conditions or other exceptional circumstances.... Art. 816.9.3.
- 3.1 If the Event combines a CEN(s) with a CEI(s), the Organiser will take all reasonable measures to ensure the biosecurity of the FEI Horses is safeguarded including but not limited to:
 - Ensure that FEI horses participating in the CEI are stabled separately from CEN horses participating in the CEN ride. If no stabling is required at your Event, please make sure they are separated in the cooling and holding areas.
 - The use of common water troughs for Horses is prohibited. Water must be drawn with a clean bucket. Horses must not drink directly from the trough.
 - Ensure that the examination upon arrival is done for all Horses according to article 1031 of the Veterinary Rules.



- It is advised that the temperature of CEN Horses is manually recorded 3 days prior to the event, and that this information is passed to the FEI Veterinarian that is carrying the Examination upon arrival.
- Ensure that all participants are advised to report any health issues to the FEI Veterinarian, so that Horse can be isolated and further testing can be done.
- Ensure that the veterinarians have enough sanitizers and gloves for the Horse inspections throughout the day.

- 4. The safety of the athletes, FEI Officials and public must be safeguarded at all times and FEI Officials must be allowed to take all necessary measures to ensure safety, as per the FEI Endurance Rules/FEI GRs:
 - The field of play Art. 813
 - Number of crew members allowed Art. 813.2.2
 - Horses must remain capable of being clearly observed at all times Art. 813.5
 - Permitted Assistance during Event or on Course Art. 822.4
 - Prohibited Assistance Art. 822.5
 - Postponement and/or cancellation of an Event FEI GRs 109.12
- 5. The FEI Officials' Code of Conduct must be adhered to including the obligations and restrictions pertaining to the "Endurance Official's Per Diems".

Any breach of the FEI Rules and Regulations will be prosecuted according to the FEI Legal System (Chapter VIII of the FEI General Regulations). Failure by an Organiser to comply with the terms of this Protocol may also lead to sanctions including the removal of future events from the FEI Calendar in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.
